- Newsletter, "Domain Wire", 2 issues a year
- Surveys
  - A-level survey, covering the registries management main aspects
  - B-survey, covering legal issues related to registries
  - Other surveys upon request of our members
- Comments and positions on several topics that may have an impact on our members

# **Benefits of diverse participation**

- CENTR values participation from many different registries
  - Western and Eastern Europe, Americas, Asia, Oceania
  - Different regulatory regimes, Internet community expectations, use of domain names etc.
  - Different challenges in ensuring stable DNS/Internet
- Provides added value
  - Brings different perspectives to discussion
  - Helps to define guidelines and best practices that benefit everyone
  - Comes to agreed opinions on certain aspects of the international arena

### **CENTR and the WSIS-WGIG process**

- Accredited business entity in the WGIG-WSIS process since 2003
- Participation in the four WGIG open consultations
- Liaison with the WGIG Secretariat through information exchanges and participation in events (CENTR Open Day)
- Participation in the ccTLD workshop organised by the WGIG Secretariat in Geneva, July 2005, and in the ccNSO workshop held in September
- CENTR comments:
  - First CENTR comment to the WGIG process, April 2005
  - CENTR Comment to the WGIG final report, August 2005



### The key factors for the CENTR Community

- Critical importance of the stability, security and robustness of the Internet infrastructure
- The principles of transparency, democracy, multi-stakeholder, inclusiveness approach for any Internet governance model
- Subsidiarity
- The importance of an environment that encourages innovation and investment
- The role of the private sector
- The importance of making existing mechanisms linked to key objectives



#### The working definition of Internet governance

- "Internet governance is not just Internet names and addresses" (WGIG report)
- The Domain Name System is only a small part of the entirety of Internet governance issues
- According to CENTR Comment to the WGIG final report, it should be clearer that governments, the private sector and the civil society participate on an equal footing "to shape the evolution and the use of the Internet"

#### The oversight function

 ICANN should continue to be the forum for cooperation for DNS issues as a service to the community, and that ICANN should focus on its core function of technical co-ordination as well as on improving inclusiveness in its processes (CENTR Comment to the WGIG final report)



#### The forum

- The proposal of creating an Internet forum left many ccTLDs perplexed
- According to the CENTR Community, the forum should only
  - Serve as a vehicle for the exchange of concerns and ideas of various sectors
  - Make provision for the effective participation of all stakeholders including non-governmental sectors from developing countries
- The regional bodies to complement the forum already exist



### The proposed models

- The CENTR Community highlighted that the proposed models:
  - Are too bureaucratic
  - Fail to meet the WSIS criteria that call for full involvement of the private sector, civil society and international organisations
  - Fail to address subsidiarity and local determination principles



#### **Critical issues**

- It is fundamental to distinguish between:
  - Those issues that may require restructuring of the present arrangements
  - Those that can be (and are expected to be) resolved within the existing frameworks
- Keep in mind that most issues are local and regional and as such are best solved at the national level



#### The future

- The "free spirit" of the Internet as a milestone and the key of any future development
- Knowledge exchange and innovation for the growth of the Internet
- Open and transparent dialogue so that all voices are heard
