STATUS QUO

- DIFO was established in 1999 and owns DK-Hostmaster A/S
- DK-Hostmaster A/S operates .dk
- A public tender for the administration of .dk was won by dotDK and Afilias in July 2008
- A decision by NITA about the administration is expected this week



DK Hostmaster A/S

- Controls and secures all .dk second level domain names
- Number of domain names: 950.000
- Number of unique registrants: 650.000
- Number of employees: 24
- Share capital: 67,000 Euro
- Turnover (2007): 3.78 mill. Euro
- Equity p.t.: 3.1 mill. Euro




Dansk Internet Forum

The (hi)story of .dk

- 1996: UNIX-association sells to DKnet A/S (subsidiary of TeleDanmark)
- 1996: Establishment of Danish ISP association (FIL)
- 1996: First formal regulation (restrictive)
- January 1997: "Liberalisation"
- 1998: Intervention by the Ministry of Research
- 1999: Dansk Internet Forum is established



First challenges

- No legislation
- The legal position of a domainname
- Dispute resolution
- Relation to trademarks
- The contractual relations of the holder of a domain name (parties, changes)



Domainname Complaint Board

- Competence
 - Relation to courts
 - Which areas of law
 - Sanctions
- Judges (Supreme court judge, law professor, lawyer and stakeholders)
- Binding effect based on contracts

Other challenges

- Relationship to registrars

- Co-operation with changing ministers
- 2003-committee and report 1450/2004
- 2005 Domain law
- Public tender spring 2008



Public tender

- The Domain law appointed DIFO as administrator
- The tender to secure competitive administration
- Technical and political criteria
- The winner is chosen on the merits of the technical solution but has to show political backing by the "Danish Internet community"
- New tender after 6 years



Public tender cont.

- Only two bidders: DIFO and dotDK (DK-Hostmaster and Afilias)
- Decision by NITA in July 2008: Afilias
- Shared registry vs. Sole registry
- Very limited political support for dotDK over the summer 2008
- Decision by NITA expected in a week!
- Possible legal disputes in the aftermath
