 \Rightarrow Tunis Agenda gave the IGF a mandate for 5 years

- ⇒UN Secretary General to make a recommendation on the desirability of the continuation of the IGF
- \Rightarrow Consultation with IGF participants
- ⇒ Decision about a continuation of the IGF to be taken by the UN Member States



IGF – Review & Evaluation

CENTR supports the continuation of the IGF

recommendations:

=> Maintain the IGF as a **non-negotiating**, **discussion forum** where to embrace internet related matters in a constructive and cooperative manner;

=> Strengthen the educative, collaborative and informative principles;

=> Enhance the **follow up** process after every yearly meeting so that the outcome of any dialogue is properly spread;

=> Better enable **remote participation** and to ensure that all the various stakeholders are properly represented and their voice heard;

=> Empower the **Secretariat** to present regular reports on the regional and national IGF initiatives and to share them via the official IGF site;
